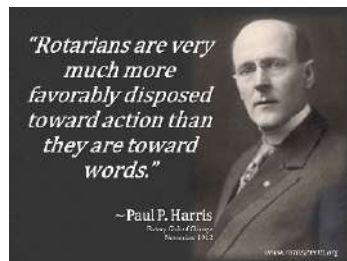

History of Rotary Club of Teluk Intan

The Rotary Club of Teluk Intan was chartered on 11 August 1952 as the Rotary Club of Teluk Anson, Federation of Malaya, under Rotary International District 46. It was the first club to be chartered after the Second World War and the sixth club in the Federation of Malaya. The other clubs being the Rotary Clubs of Seremban, Kuala Lumpur, Ipoh, Penang and Taiping.

There were 25 charter members and the Charter President was Dr. Ibrahim bin Haji Mohd. Yassin, a dental officer with the Infant Welfare Centre, Teluk Anson. The club meetings were held at 1pm on Tuesdays, at the local Rest House. On the 3rd Tuesday of every month, there was a Dinner meeting at 8pm. The admission fee was M\$20 and the annual membership fee was M\$48.

The Sponsor Club was the Rotary Club of Ipoh and the District Governor's Special Representative was its President Leong Min On. The District Governor at that time was Khoo Teik Ee.

In 1952, Teluk Anson, as the town was then called, had a population of 22,961. The Rotary Club was first organized on 4 March 1952. The club president applied for membership in Rotary International on 20 May 1952 and, in his recommendation to Rotary International on 7 June 1952, the then District Governor of R.I. District 46, Eusoff, wrote:

"The prospect of a Rotary Club was examined as early as 1951 during the Presidentship of H. Wakefield of the Rotary Club of Ipoh. An extension survey was carried out by President Leong Min On; he was assisted by H. Haines a Past District Governor (in China) now a member of the Rotary Club of Ipoh. The inaugural meeting was attended by seven members of the Ipoh Club.

I visited this Provisional (Club) on two occasions --- on the last one, I conducted a Club Forum.

Teluk Anson is the Chief Port for the State of Perak and in a very important rubber planting area. It is about 70 miles from Ipoh."

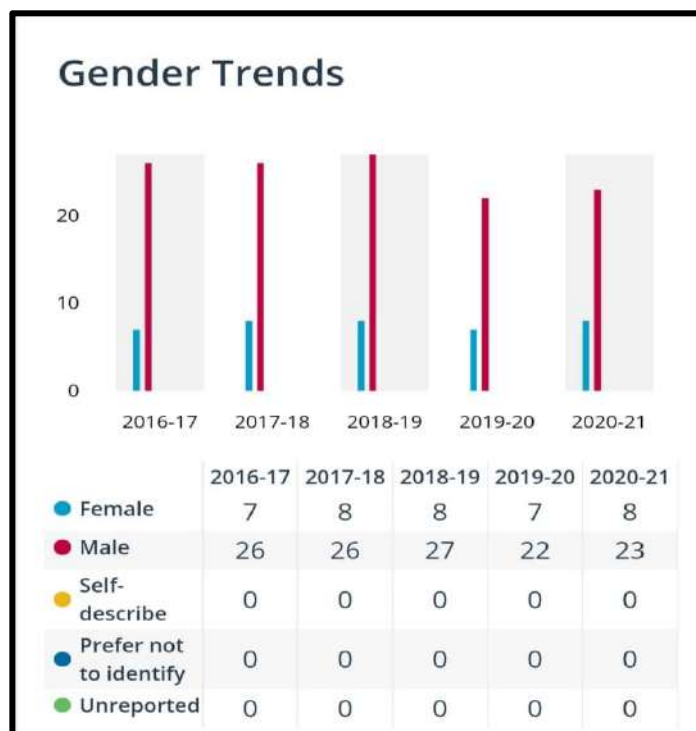

Gender Trends



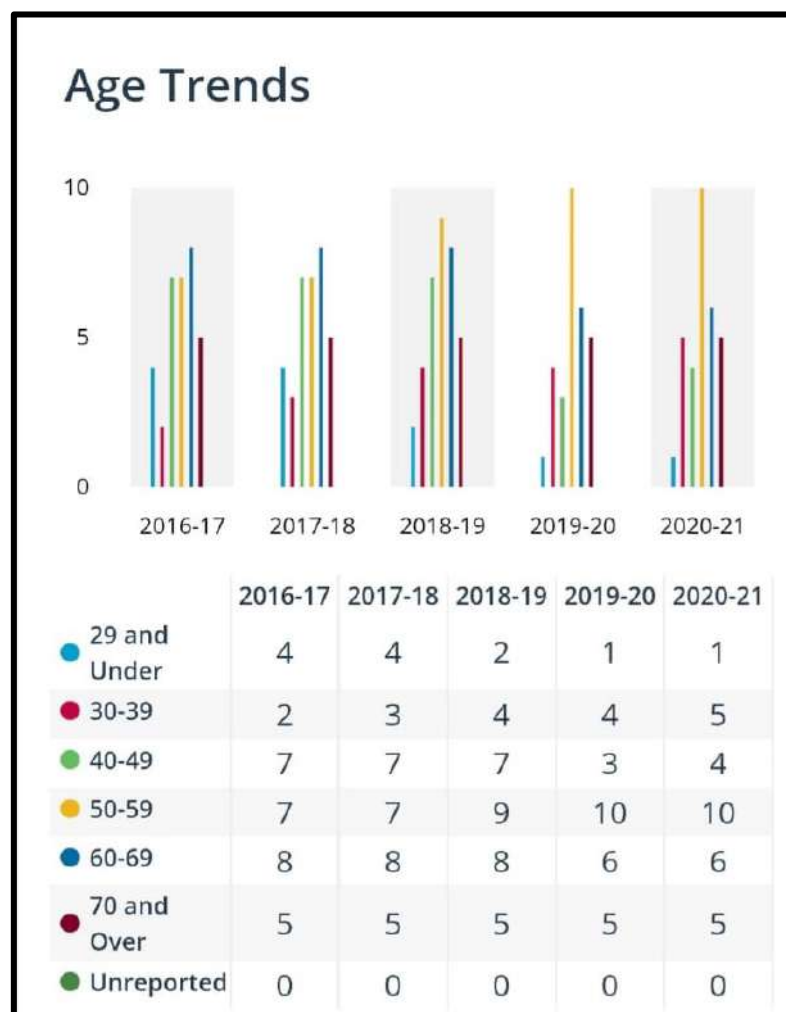


Fellowship with two new members

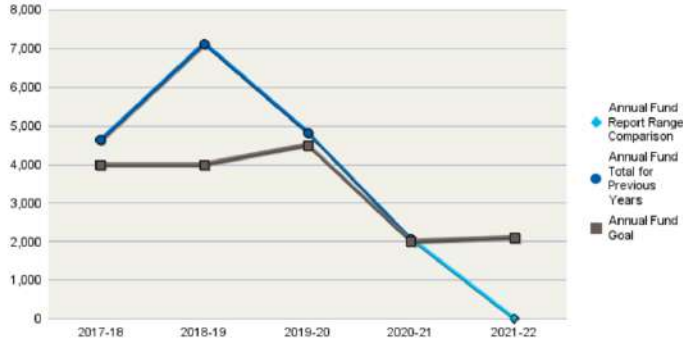

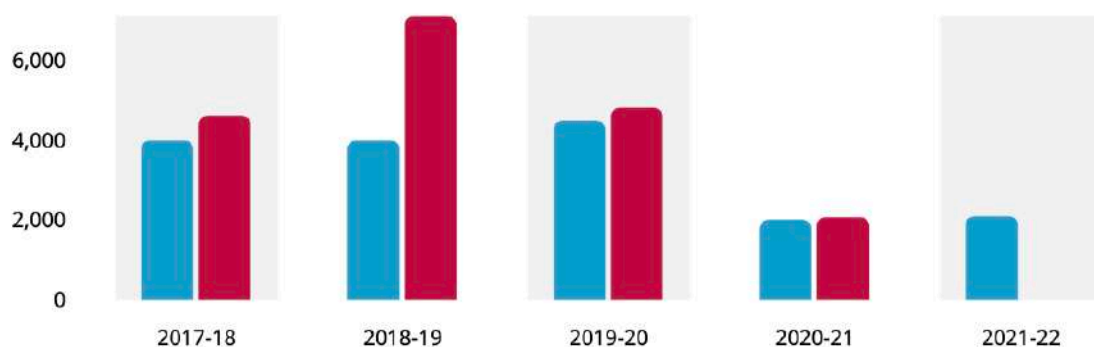

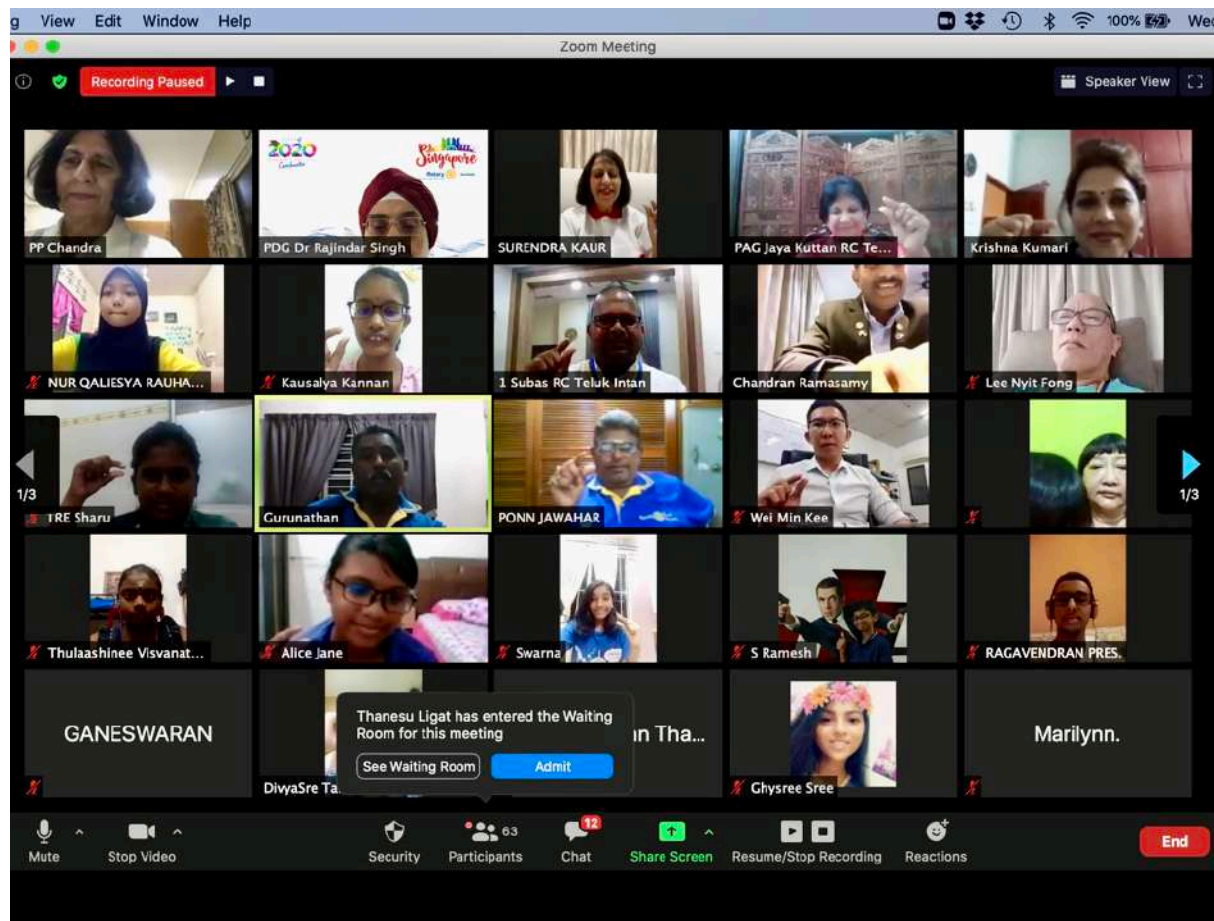


World Polio Day

2. Project in Progress- Laptops for the needy students.

Five laptops were allocated under the District grant for the needy students. This project is set to benefit the needy students.

Addressing the pressing need of students who are deprived of necessary tools to help them cope with distance learning amid the Covid-19 pandemic, the project aims to provide equal opportunity for students to access educational resources.

Noting that students from low-income and marginalized families were the most affected in their studies during the movement control order, Rotary Club of Teluk Intan focused on education and built on sustainable relief.

Most students depend on computers to have access to their studies. Some rely on smartphones and those who do not have the means for either of these gadgets were left out of education in the new norm and this was one of the reasons why this project was introduced.

3. Distributions of Sanitizers and story books To Schools

A few schools requested for sanitizers and story books for the pupils and we from the Rotary Club of Teluk Intan fulfilled their requirement as we realized that schools have a massive need for the sanitizing products. The use of hand sanitizer was determined to be an essential means of providing personal hygiene when hand washing was not an option.

With COVID-19 impacting communities around the world, the Rotary Club of Teluk Intan is trying to help our schools who may not have access or the resources to obtain hand sanitizer.

全面封鎖助援活動大減

貧戶孤老苦上加苦

(安顺3日讯)相信是疫情拖得久,经济低迷,加上不适合多人同时出动原因,与去年首次行动管制期比较,目前的全面封锁行动管制令期间,民间助援活动大减,等候慈善组织前来援助的贫穷家庭,生活就更困苦了。

方萧凯传:疫情拖久积蓄用尽

许多人记忆犹新,去年首阶段行动管制令期间,安顺多个慈善队伍在各区派发粮食、鲜鱼、蔬菜、口罩等援助品,但今年的全面封锁行管令期

间,这类活动少见了。

安顺扶轮社前社长方萧凯传向星洲日报《大霹靂》社区报说,该社在去年疫情开始时并没有派发援助品,但今年感受到许多困苦家庭生活更辛苦,决定先派发100份价值100令吉的粮食援助品。

“在派发援助品期间,我深深感受到一些贫困家庭生活的不易,他们是想去工作赚钱,但因行动管制令不能这么做,由于平时收入不高,经过近一年半的各阶段行管令,许多人积蓄已用尽,造成他们的生活比去年更辛苦了。”

她说,安顺扶轮社从学校着手,挑出哪些连孩子上网课都成问题的家庭,向他们提供援助,要做到协助真正有需要的家庭。

“一些家庭为了让孩子们上网课,动用家庭积蓄购买电脑设备,结果在粮食方面花费就成问题。”

鄧國林:貧老留守家鄉生活拮据

安顺芭尾新村村长邓国林说,安顺一名行善不具名的善心人通过陈盈盈,捐助购买50份粮食,由他和陈盈盈分发给芭尾新村的贫困户。

他说,一些老年人,孩子在外地工作,他们留守家乡,需走路或骑脚车出外购买必需品或食物,有者甚么面对经济问题,生活过得很辛苦。

“今年分发粮食给贫困户的活动大减,需要援助的家庭接收到的援助品就更少了。在发送援助品给他们时,我都感受到他们生活上的无奈。”

邓国林也吁请为人儿女们尽快协助父母注册接种疫苗,因为他们上了年纪,属于冠病高风险群。

吴家良:安顺火箭获善士出资

安顺社青团团长吴家良说,从去年行管令至今,安顺行动党获得安顺国会议员倪可敏及善心人出资,购买粮食、成人尿片、口罩等物资发给贫困户。

“大部分的资金来自倪可敏本身,特别是今年,善心捐款有减少的趋势。相信是因为疫情拖得太久,影响人们的经济,另一方面是目前全面封锁情况,不适合多人出外派送物资。”

他表示,一些长者子女不在身旁,他们的生活都得靠自己设法解决,情况令人同情。这类年长父母多达十多户。

History of Sewing Skills Centre

The Rotary Club of Teluk Intan set up the Sewing Skills Centre in October 2010 with a Grant of MYR 60,300.00 from the CIMB Foundation. The CIMB Foundation provided 20 sewing machines at a cost of MYR 22,987.25 and the balance of MYR 37,312.75 was to carry out the project. The 20 sewing machines comprised of 15 single needle lockstitch Singer Machines, 3 Overlock Singer Machines and 2 Embroidery Singer Machines. The Centre was set up in a rented shop lot at 1st Floor, No.116-1, Jalan Intan 5, Bandar Baru Teluk Intan.

The training commenced on 10 November 2010 with 15 poor single mothers identified by the Welfare Department. The basic training was provided by a Trainer from Nyok Lan Garments Factory for six months at no cost. Upon completion of the first module four single mothers found employment in garment factories. The remaining 10 participants were provided advanced training by a qualified tutor Mrs. Liew Ghin Hwa. The second batch of 15 participants started their basic training on 4 June 2012. On evaluation in December 2012 six of the original participants were found to be efficient in tailoring. They were able to earn a decent income through stitching various garments.

By November 2012 the funds provided by the CIMB Foundation were depleted. We were fortunate to receive a grant of MYR 14,550.00 from the Perak State Government to keep the project running.

On 17 April 2014 we received our second grant from the CIMB Foundation for MYR 38,000. New students were taken in as places became available. By the end of 2015 another 20 students were proficient and could earn up to MYR800 per month.

Since the start of the project nearly 150 underprivileged women have been trained and many are now earning between MYR500.00 and MYR2000.00 per month. Inspired by the success of this project we applied to the CIMB Foundation for the third grant for MYR23,400 and this was approved.

2020 - 2021

An average of twenty students had been training in sewing skills every month. During the lockdown physical class was not held but on-line classes continued.

A number of students have been qualified for the sewing skill certificate.

There is good demographic mix of students.

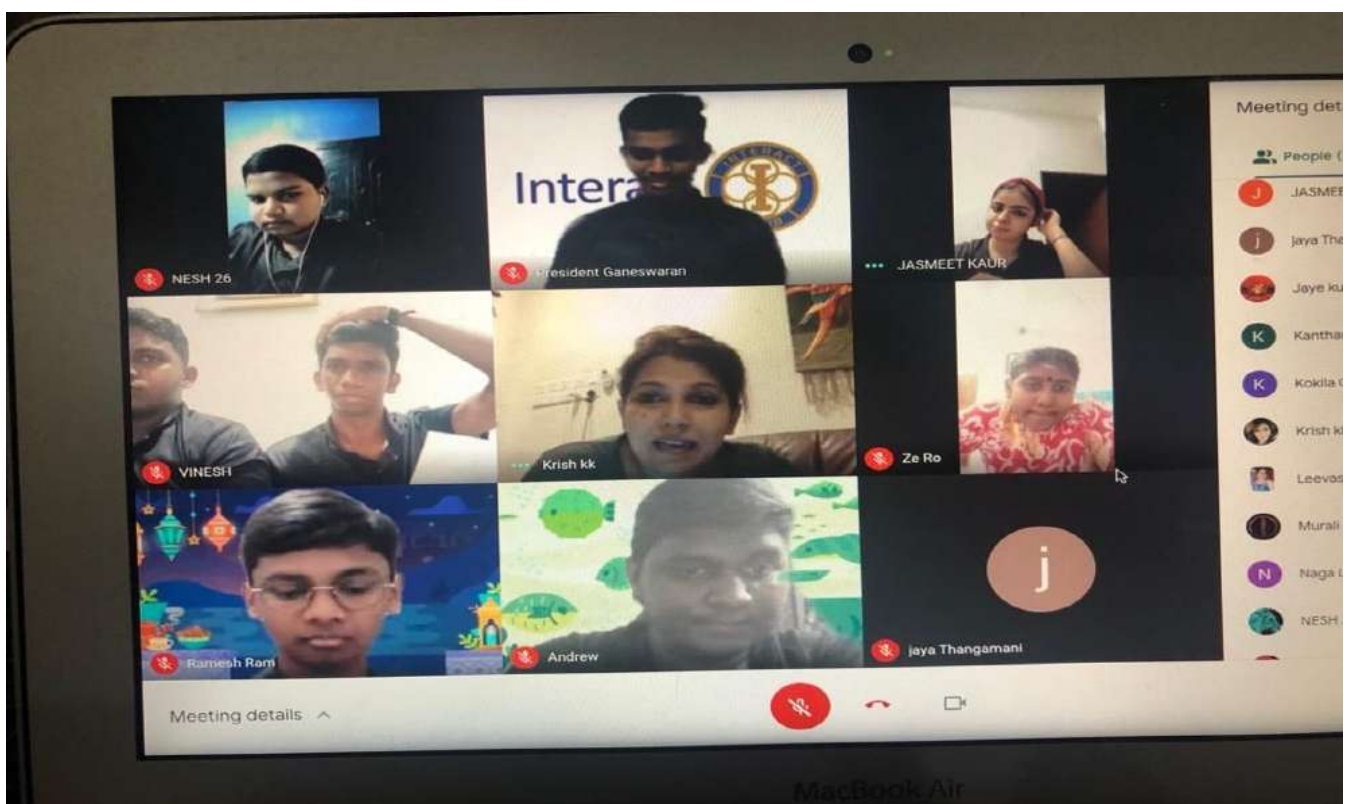
3. Installations of New Board

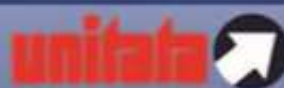
