## HISTORY OF ROTARY CLUB OF TELUK INTAN

---

The Rotary Club of Teluk Intan was chartered on 11 August 1952 as the Rotary Club of Teluk Anson, Federation of Malaya, under Rotary International District 46. It was the first club to be chartered after the Second World War and the sixth club in the Federation of Malaya. The other clubs being the Rotary Clubs of Seremban, Kuala Lumpur, Ipoh, Penang and Taiping.

There were 25 charter members and the Charter President was Dr. Ibrahim bin Haji Mohd. Yassin, a dental officer with the Infant Welfare Centre, Teluk Anson. The club meetings were held at 1pm on Tuesdays, at the local Rest House. On the 3rd Tuesday of every month, there was a Dinner meeting at 8pm. The admission fee was M\$20 and the annual membership fee was M\$48.

The Sponsor Club was the Rotary Club of Ipoh and the District Governor's Special Representative was its President Leong Min On. The District Governor at that time was Khoo Teik Ee.

In 1952, Teluk Anson, as the town was then called, had a population of 22,961. The Rotary Club was first organized on 4 March 1952. The club president applied for membership in Rotary International on 20 May 1952 and, in his recommendation to Rotary International on 7 June 1952, the then District Governor of R.I. District 46, Eusoff, wrote:

*"The prospect of a Rotary Club was examined as early as 1951 during the Presidentship of H. Wakefield of the Rotary Club of Ipoh. An extension survey was carried out by President Leong Min On; he was assisted by H. Haines a Past District Governor (in China) now a member of the Rotary Club of Ipoh. The inaugural meeting was attended by seven members of the Ipoh Club.*

*I visited this Provisional (Club) on two occasions --- on the last one, I conducted a Club Forum.*

*Teluk Anson is the Chief Port for the State of Perak and in a very important rubber planting area. It is about 70 miles from Ipoh."*

YOUNG adults with special needs in Sarawak now have more opportunities to lead an independent life following the opening of a workshop and vocational training centre for them.

The centre costs RM13mil, with the construction cost borne by KCS Group of Companies as part of its corporate social responsibilities.

"Today our dream has come true. This centre can accommodate 300 young adults with special needs, to be trained in living skills," said Association for Children with Special Needs, Sibul president Datuk Janet Lau at the launch of the centre.

Janet said that when the project was first mooted in 2010, KCS Managing director Datuk Henry Lau responded positively to sponsor the construction cost.

Association honorary secretary Dr Toh Tek Hock said the building committee headed by Janet managed to convince the Sarawak government in 2010 to allow them to use a portion of land next to the Agape Centre in Jalan Alan for the project.

Agape Centre is a community-based centre that houses the Lau King Howe Memorial Children's Clinic and four NGOs - Association for Children with Special Needs, Sibul Autistic Association, Methodist Care Centre and Special Olympics Sarawak. Sibul Chairman

## Training special needs youths to be independent

New RM13mil centre in Sibul can accommodate 300 young adults

"This centre provides job skills for young adults with special needs so that they can live independently," said Dr Toh.

The Methodist Care Centre, for example, is operating a car wash centre for these young adults.

Henry said he and his company were not seeking recognition by sponsoring the project.

## More schools urged to set up special education programmes

CHILDREN with special needs should be sent to schools with special education programmes so that they can learn effectively, says a community service director.

Fong Siew Kai Chuan, who is with the Teluk Intan Rotary Club, said children with special needs should not be kept at home but should be sent to school so they get the opportunity to learn.

"Parents with special children need to send them to school so that they can learn some life skills," he said.

"Only by receiving special education can these children grow and learn to be independent," she said after Rotary International District 3309 governor Dr Krishna Kumar

launched a multi-sensory therapy classroom at SK Dato Lakshama Raja Mahkota in Teluk Intan.

A group of a child with autism who graduated from university in the UK after receiving special education, so they should be given the opportunity to learn," Fong added.

The multi-sensory classroom was set up by the club, through a grant from Rotary Foundation and is part of the Education Ministry's Integrated Special Education Programme.

Programme children include slow learners and those who are dyslexic, autistic, with attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder and Down syndrome.

Fong, who used to be a president of the club, said there were seven schools in Teluk Intan that offer special education.

Apart from SK Dato Lakshama Raja Mahkota, she said other schools with a special education programme were SK Methodist Girls, SK Kampung Bahagia, SK Dato Yehya Subhan, SK Sungai Jelutong, SK Seri Intan and SK Seri Setia.

She said SK Dato Lakshama Raja Mahkota had 504 pupils, and 52 of them were special needs children.

"The school has pre-school special education, education for learning disabilities and education for the visually-impaired."

"They have 15 teachers and are assisted by five assistants," she said.

Fong said she hoped that most schools, including vernacular schools, would set up programmes for special needs children.

She said there was still a social stigma that schools with special programmes could give people the wrong impression.

"Some folks may think that by sending their normal children to these schools, their child may be perceived as being someone with special needs."

"I think more awareness should be created to educate people to change their mindset," she added.

Fong also said the club was now looking to set up a multi-sensory room at another school, probably in Itan Melintang.

"Bethany Hume, which looks after special and disabled children in Itan Melintang, closed operations last year, leaving the children without an avenue for proper education."

"I understand that there is some licensing issue, so many of the children are not being sent to school and are cooped up at home."

"This is one of the reasons we are looking to set up a multi-sensory classroom in the area, so that the children can continue learning," she added.

## Chance for young people with learning disabilities to learn new skills

YOUTH in Selangor with learning disabilities can now apply for a placement with the state government's Independent Living Support Centre (ILSC).

ILSC is a training programme funded by Yayasan Warisan Anak Selangor (YAWAS) and Selangor NGOs as the latter's partner.

Applicants eligible for the programme are those aged between 17 and 22 with learning disabilities such as autism, Down's syndrome, intellectual disability, hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and global developmental delay (GDD).
